NOT count as community service.

- Non-profit organizations such as charities, hospitals, nursing homes, soup kitchens, and senior centers, and homeless shelters can be used to complete

community service.

- The four page form, which includes a pre-approval page, a preparation page, a verification page, and a reflection page must be completed in full for hours to count.
